EDITORIAL NOVEMBER 2024

Every year, I solemnly announce to my wife that the central heating will not be switched on until November. If she gets cold, she can put on another jumper. Or her coat and gloves. Of course, my valiant attempts to prevent the house being turned into a sauna are futile and I eventually relent when she hides the TV remote for the umpteenth time, my logic being that I'd rather sit there sweltering than be forced to watch Emmerdale Farm on a never-ending loop. But guess what? As I write this, on the afternoon of the 29th October 2024, the heating controls remain firmly in the off position, and I'm on target to achieve my goal of a heating-free October. It's not usual to be this mild is it? What's more, someone's just walked past the front window wearing shorts, and the neighbours have got their windows open. I really can't get my head around the weather this year.

My expectations of the weather are invariable based on nothing more scientific than memories formed many years ago. Looking back, it tends to be those long, hot summers such as those of 1976 or 2003, when the sun shone seemingly non-stop for weeks on end, that dominate our thoughts. Eventually, we come to equate summers with heatwaves, and forget all those summer holidays stuck on a campsite in Cornwall when the rain was lashing down and all you wanted to do was go home. There's a reason why people started to go abroad for their holidays you know. It's the same with the winter months. I always associate the hour changing with the arrival of winter, and associate winter with the arrival of Christmas. My memories of November are dominated by crisp white frosts and the sort of icy air that freezes your fillings. On Guy Fawkes night, the family would stand around the bonfire, and I'd be wrapped up to the nines to protect me against the cold with a welcome mug of cocoa in my one good hand, the other one being wrapped in bandages after I grabbed the wrong end of the sparkler. We'd gasp at the fireworks lighting up the night sky until an errant Catherine Wheel or Jumping Jack landed in the hood of my parka, bringing proceedings to a premature end. At least it was warm in casualty. But, the more I think about it, such a scenario was probably the exception, and more often than not bonfire nights had to be delayed and re-arranged due to the inclement weather. In fact, I clearly remember once standing in pouring rain on The Downs in Bristol, watching the annual Evening Post Firework Extravaganza, desperately trying to catch a fleeting glimpse of the fireworks after they emerged from behind the sea of umbrellas and before they burrowed into the low-lying cloud which spoiled the effect somewhat. As for white Christmases, can anyone even remember one in these parts? I can't. Maybe our current weather is not so unseasonal after all.

As we move towards winter, events to mark the festive season are springing up and beginning to fill the Local Talk Back calendar (although you'd gave to go some to beat Tesco's in Yate who revealed their Christmas aisle at the end of August – those first mince pies have probably exceeded their use-by dates already!). Dates for Carol services in our local churches have been announced, and Acton Turville Social are having Fireside Carols at the Fox & Hounds on the 6th December, which is always well attended. As usual, Badminton Estate have a flurry of Christmas-themed events to look forward to, including a couple of wreath-making workshops which, based on feedback and some particularly nicely decorated front doors, proved very popular last year. Book early, as Fred Pontin used to say. If you're organising an event, please let us know so we can include details it in next month's newsletter.

To end this month's Editorial, we're launching our own 2024 Local Talk Back Christmas Appeal. 



Church Matters November 2024 Letter from the Vicar

Dear Friends,

My letter today is a bit of an appeal.

Some people think ministry is just about taking Sunday services. But you can find yourself doing all kinds of things on a given day. Ranging from:

- Leading a small group of parishioners in prayer online which is spiritually nurturing and gives people an opportunity to come together.
- It is telling a story to a group of school children that has Christian values and helping them to understand that they have spiritual selves.
- It is visiting the local Care Home and praying with Residents, all in their 80's and 90's, and listening to them reminiscing about the good things that life has given them.
- It is helping the bereaved to prepare for a funeral service in which they can say farewell to their loved ones, and giving comfort.
- It is giving a listening ear when life throws people a curve ball, and often being a confidant. It is helping young people prepare for marriage and to the promises they are making.

Of course there are always masses of emails to accompany all these tasks, PCC meetings, Clergy meetings, school governor meetings, trusteeships....the list goes on!

Ministry is often misunderstood, it is not just on a Sunday. Actually it is about serving a whole community from the newly born to those coming towards the end of their lives. It is about continuing family traditions and values that have the church at their heart. It's about helping people on their spiritual journey and providing a place where people can come together. It is about representing the church on Charitable Trusts.

This is only able to happen because people give to the church. The parishes do not receive any financial support other than that which can be raised locally.

If you want this work to continue, then I encourage you **most earnestly** to consider giving to your local church. If you wish, you can contact me for the address of your local treasurer. You can pledge a regular amount of money by standing order or on the parish giving scheme as kind supporters already do, and consider including the local church in your will as a legacy (this has helped many local churches greatly with their upkeep over the years)

Since Covid, the risk of local ministry not always being there is rather high. So please do think and pray about this.

ACTON TURVILLE PARISH COUNCIL

NOVEMBER 2024 REPORT

Current Actions: Over recent months the Parish Council has raised a number of issues with our District Councillors or directly with the relevant team in South Glos Council. In some cases, such as the recent spate of fly tipping incidents on the Sodbury Road, action has been taken promptly and the situation quickly resolved. Other issues are proving less straightforward to resolve, including the installation of Bus Stop signs, replacing the signs at the "Clump of Trees" to warn drivers of the dangerous corner, and dealing with an outbreak of dog fouling. We will continue to press for these and other matters to be dealt with, and will update progress in our monthly reports. Speeding in the village remains a concern, particularly traffic entering the village on the Luckington Road, which has resulted in a spate of collisions. So far the consequences have been confined to vehicle damage, but the risk of someone being seriously injured or killed is very real. A group of villagers, supported by the Parish Council, are now taking this up with our local District Councillors and Police, to see what action may be taken to manage the problem. Concerns have also again been raised about traffic in the vicinity of the school at drop-off and collection times. Once again, options for preventing a serious incident are being discussed with the relevant authorities. Police Update. As previously reported, our local PCSO Cheryl Dibble from Avon & Somerset Police has been making regular visits to the village in the Community Police Van. The next scheduled visit is planned for the 10th December from 10am to 11.30am in the Fox & Hounds car park. However, the Police report that very few people have been making use of the service, and the need for future visits is being reviewed. The van provides an excellent opportunity to chat informally to our local Policing team and it would be a shame if the facility was withdrawn so why not pay them a visit and say hello?


